2 MS. LAMBERTON: I would like to 1 call the board of supervisors regular business 2 meeting of January 7, 2019 to order. We'll forego 3 the pledge of allegiance. 4 5 Any announcements? 6 JJ? Autumn? I didn't mean to catch 7 you off quard. You good? 8 I'll entertain a motion to 9 consider the minutes of the December 18, 2018, 10 regular business meeting and the December 21, 2018, 11 12 special meeting. MS. PICKARD: So moved. 13 MR. CARROLL: You're doing both? 14 MR. HOLAHAN: Second. 15 I got a motion MS. LAMBERTON: 16 17 and a second. Any questions or comments from 18 19 the --MR. CARROLL: Yeah, I --20 -- board? MS. LAMBERTON: 21 MR. CARROLL: I have a question 22 in regard to December -- or a correction, I -- I 23 think it's a correction. 24 25 MS. LAMBERTON: Okay.

3 MR. CARROLL: December 21, 2018, 1 special meeting, Paragraph 4(a), second sentence. 2 I think we granted the conditional zoning permit 3 and not a conditional building permit. As my -- as 4 I understand it, we don't issue building permits. 5 We issue third-party Bureau Veritas. 6 MR. REISS: You didn't issue any 7 permit that administratively --8 MR. CARROLL: Conditional --9 MR. REISS: -- permits will be 10 issued. 11 12 MR. CARROLL: Okay. MR. REISS: You granted a 13 conditional approval based upon the request that 14 was made to start some earth movement activities 15 and to put in footers. 16 MR. CARROLL: Then maybe we 17 should eliminate the word building permit or --18 MR. REISS: Yes, I would 19 eliminate --20 MR. CARROLL: Okay. 21 MR. REISS: -- the word permit 22 23 altogether. MR. CARROLL: Okay. Conditional 24 25

REISS: -- as a special exception as opposed to a by-right use. 25

8 MS. LAMBERTON: I don't know 1 2 why. MS. PICKARD: Who did the -- the 3 4 county? 5 MS. LAMBERTON: Monroe County 6 Planning Commission. Right. 7 MR. REISS: MS. LAMBERTON: And I don't 8 9 understand why. MS. PICKARD: I don't understand 10 11 why either. MR. REISS: But the township 12 planning commission reviewed it and recommended 13 moving forward as written. So the question is, do 14 you want to change that or keep it as is, in which 15 case I could then advertise it for a public 16 17 hearing. MS. PICKARD: I would leave it 18 19 as is. MS. LAMBERTON: I -- I don't see 20 why anyone should have to go for a special 21 22 exception --MS. PICKARD: It's just going to 23 24 raise the rates of the daycare --MS. LAMBERTON: I mean, we're 25

9 trying to make it more user-friendly, and that's a 1 service to the community that folks need. 2 MS. PICKARD: Well, that's just 3 going to pass it on --4 5 MS. LAMBERTON: Yeah. MS. PICKARD: -- to the consum 6 7 MS. LAMBERTON: Right. 8 MS. PICKARD: -- you know, the 9 10 clients. Right. 11 MS. LAMBERTON: It's high enough. MS. PICKARD: 12 MS. LAMBERTON: Oh, I think that 13 that's your question. 14 MS. PICKARD: -- signs on top of 15 16 MR. CARROLL: Well, that -- I --17 I read it as that's the way it's written, but 18 19 that's --MS. LAMBERTON: Can we --20 MR. REISS: Well, no, no, no. 21 You have to read the next sentence, next phrase. 22 MR. CARROLL: Okay. 23 MR. REISS: "And be used in such 24 a manner that the carrying of such signs or signs 25

12 is no longer incidental to the vehicle's primary 1 2 purpose." So the primary purpose of your 3 vehicles is pickup trucks to go to places, get 4 Thi -- this is for where the sign is the 5 stuff. primary purpose, i.e., it's parked in a parking 6 7 lot. MR. CARBONE: You park in front 8 9 of the place and it doesn't move. MR. CARROLL: But if -- but if I 10 have one my trailers with a wrap on it or something 11 like that to show my bu -- that I leave on a job 12 13 site or --MR. REISS: That's fine. As 14 long as -- because it's not intended to stay there 15 permanently. Basically this is trying to prevent 16 17 It would be like MR. JABLOWSKI: 18 a pickup truck with two 4 by 8s on the side saying, 19 20 "Eat at Joe's". MR. REISS: That's just parked 21 22 somewhere. What's wrong MS. LAMBERTON: 23 24 with that? MS. PICKARD: We've had people 25

13 that are using them because they couldn't get any 1 more signage into the building --2 MR. CARROLL: Exactly. 3 MS. PICKARD: -- so they'd have 4 a bunch of cars or trucks that are parked there 5 that aren't being used. I know one of them was 6 parked at Blakeslee Corners that was never moved 7 and we had some issue about it being moved. It 8 needed to be moved within 24 hours or something. 9 10 So we had some issues there. I know one in Mount Pocono, 11 there's a mattress truck that sometimes parked in a 12 little turnaround off of 940. It just sits. It's 13 a billboard. It's being used as a billboard. 14 Maybe we need to talk about it 15 16 further at a work session to --Yeah, maybe to 17 MR. CARBONE: specify it a little bit better. 18 19 MS. PICKARD: Yeah. So 20 MS. LAMBERTON: All right. you want to table that for now? 21 22 MR. CARBONE: Yeah. MS. LAMBERTON: Okay. 23 MR. CARROLL: Thank you. 24 25 MS. LAMBERTON: We're gonna hold

off on that. And we're going to table the public hearing for the proposed ordinance amending Chapter 9, fire companies.

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MR. REISS: I do have one other 4 John and I had a conversation with Mr. Toon 5 item. the attorney for the proposed developer for Pocono 6 Springs, regarding the professional services 7 agreement to cover the township's professional 8 outside -- its professional consultants' costs plus 9 its engineers. It would've required an escrow of 10 They are requesting not to have the 11 \$10,000. escrow; they're willing to enter into the 12 agreement. They would like to basically pay as 13 they go until they file a formal plan in front of 14 15 the township.

So basically what they're 16 proposing is that the township would incur the 17 expense, administratively would bill the developer, 18 and the developer then would have 30 days to pay to 19 20 reimburse the township basically as opposed to having money in the escrow, taking it out, and 21 then, when it got below 5,000, notifying them that 22 there was -- you know, they had to --23 24 MS. LAMBERTON: Replenish it. MR. REISS: -- replenish it. 25

15 MS. PICKARD: Where did \$10,000 1 come from? 2 3 MR. CARROLL: Yeah, that --MR. CARBONE: Yeah --4 MR. JABLOWSKI: We looked at 5 that as probably a safe bet with the volume of work 6 that was going on there. They -- they didn't 7 disagree with that. When it comes time to do that, 8 our conversation was 10,000, which was a number we 9 10 just -- we came up with. They're just MR. CARROLL: 11 12 cutting that curb, aren't they? 13 MR. CARBONE: Right. For this, yeah, 14 MR. JABLOWSKI: they're cutting the curb on this. 15 MR. CARROLL: And, well, there's 16 17 18 MR. REISS: Periodically I am involved in phone conferences. I think Bob's 19 probably involved in more stuff. 20 MR. JABLOWKSI: We're starting 21 to run the bills up and we just want to make sure 22 23 the township is reimbursed for the costs. MR. CARROLL: Oh, absolutely. 24 And they 25 MR. JABLOWSKI:

16 understand that. 1 MR. CARBONE: Well, they 2 understand it. 3 We have to go MR. JABLOWSKI: 4 through PSA, but once they -- their thought is, 5 once they submit the land development, they 6 understand that here the clock is really gonna go 7 into full, which would be fairly soon. 8 MS. PICKARD: I'm okay with that 9 as long as it's paid promptly, but if it gets 10 behind, then I think we'd need to --11 Well, we wanted MR. JABLOWSKI: 12 something formal to be in front of them say, look, 13 here's a valid agreement that the gentleman's time, 14 the L&V -- in this case, L&V Engineering doing 15 Kalahari Boulevard, we're going to get a bill for 16 that. We want them to pay for it, they understand 17 they have to pay for it, but we have to memorialize 18 19 something in writing. MR. REISS: So I can -- I had 20 given them a sample agreement. I can revise it to 21 take out the escrow and just to say they have to 22 pay within 30 days of the date of the bill, not 23 from when they receive the bill. 24 MR. CARROLL: Right. That's 25

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18 It's Wayne MR. WAYNE GROSS: 1 2 Gross, RKR Hess. Thank you. 3 THE REPORTER: MS. LAMBERTON: Sorry. 4 MR. WAYNE GROSS: It's no 5 6 problem. So we've been working on this 7 special study corridor study for the commercial 8 9 areas and where we're on the process was that we had done the spray irrigation analysis on one of 10 the larger properties adjacent to the Pocono Summit 11 West service area and submitted that to the 12 department. They did a -- took forever to do a 13 review on it, gave us some feedback for comments, 14 15 and then they wanted other large properties adjacent to that area reevaluated for spray 16 irrigation on-lot -- on-lot disposal for those 17 properties as part of the antidegradation analysis 18 that has to be done in order to justify the other 19 alternative, the chosen alternative, which would be 20 continue with a stream discharge for the treatment 21 22 plan in that area. 23 So we did that. We've put 24 together a draft of those other properties that we've come up with, the analysis. And at this 25

point we gotta finish up some plans, so we'd probably submit that in the next couple of weeks here for that. Overall, depending on when the department can get back to us on a review of that, we're trying to set up another meeting related to that with the department on -- on another issue, and we can talk to them about a turnaround time on that date.

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I'm volunteered to actually 9 review that analysis separate from the sewage 10 planning module -- or Sewage Act 537 special study 11 submitted separate from that in order to move --12 move the project along. So with that, if they take 13 a couple months, we should be in a position maybe 14 around June to actually have everything done and 15 submitted for the public comments and get that to 16 the department at that time. 17

One of the other things that 18 came up from a meeting back in December with the 19 department was reallocation of the flows for the 20 in which it treatment plant there at Pinecrest 21 would be the chosen selected service area treatment 22 plant for the Pocono Summit West. And some of that 23 -- outcome of that was about transferring sewage 24 flow from the allocated service area to the Pocono 25

20 Summit West. We still have to do the spray 1 irrigation analysis on everything in that area, but 2 they're -- they seem to be open to that. 3 They've asked for a 4 preconsultation meeting. I've reached out to John 5 and also to Steve in Aqua PA. Aqua PA owns the 6 treatment plant. The department wants the township 7 and the -- the treatment plant owner to be involved 8 in that meeting. We got some dates out there to 9 them. Hopefully they can get back to us maybe next 10 -- maybe prior to next week for the meeting. So 11 it's depending on when -- when the department's 12 available for that meeting. 13 And that's kind of where we're 14 at with that. 15 So you think MS. LAMBERTON: 16 it'll be ready to go up to the department for 17 approval in Ju -- in June? Excuse me. 18 MR. WAYNE GROSS: If we can go 19 through this analysis. And we basically have the 20 -- the sprayer analysis done, and it depends on how 21 long it's gonna take them to review that. I think 22 if we have this meeting next week or the week 23 after, we can ask. 24 MS. LAMBERTON: Can we give them 25

21 a deadline? 1 MR. WAYNE GROSS: Pardon me? 2 3 Can we give them a dead --MS. LAMBERTON: Can we give them 4 5 a deadline? MR. WAYNE GROSS: I guess we can 6 7 give them a deadline. MS. LAMBERTON: We can ask, 8 9 right? MR. WAYNE GROSS: Right. You 10 11 know, we can ask. MS. LAMBERTON: And tell them 12 our goal would be to submit it by June, so, you 13 know, if you could turn around in 30 days. 14 MR. JABLOWSKI: How's May? 15 16 Could we submit in May? You can say --MS. LAMBERTON: 17 MR. WAYNE GROSS: You can always 18 19 as --MS. LAMBERTON: -- whatever you 20 21 want. You can always ask, right? MR. WAYNE GROSS: You can always 22 23 ask. MR. JABLOWKSI: How's April? 24 MR. WAYNE GROSS: The option is 25

22 you just submit the analysis as it is, go through 1 the -- the public comment, the planning commissions 2 and then reviews and then come to the supervisors 3 for action. And then, if they make comments at 4 that time, you're back going through the whole --5 MS. LAMBERTON: To square one. 6 MR. WAYNE GROSS: -- process 7 So we're trying --8 again. MS. LAMBERTON: Right. That's 9 10 why --MR. WAYNE GROSS: We're trying 11 12 to --MS. LAMBERTON: Push it along. 13 MR. WAYNE GROSS: -- push it 14 15 along --MS. LAMBERTON: Yeah. 16 MR. WAYNE GROSS: -- in that 17 18 respect, so --MS. LAMBERTON: Yeah, yep. 19 MS. PICKARD: That's exciting to 20 hear dates that I'd live to see this. 21 22 MR. CARROLL: Well, it's been 23 two years. MS. LAMBERTON: You'll be okay. 24 MR. WAYNE GROSS: Well, right 25

23 now the focus is strictly on the Pocono Summit West 1 2 is -- is the goal with the township, which is to --3 to pursue. 4 MS. LAMBERTON: Well, I think 5 also too if -- if maybe we could express to them that, look, we're -- we're interested in putting 6 in, you know, the dry sewer because we have, you 7 8 know, road improvements that the townships are --9 MR. WAYNE GROSS: Right. 10 MS. LAMBERTON: -- undertaking, 11 you know, just so they understand --12 MR. WAYNE GROSS: Did that come 13 up at that other meeting? 14 Yeah, okay. I think reemphasize 15 all these things that --16 MS. LAMBERTON: Sure. 17 MR. WAYNE GROSS: -- PennDOT's 18 invested lot of money, the township's invested a 19 lot of money into things. MS. LAMBERTON: We're trying to 20 21 get the state agencies to work together. 22 Since they MR. JABLOWSKI: 23 don't, we're trying. 24 MS. LAMBERTON: Right? No, but I mean, that's what -- that would -- that would be 25

24 a nice scenario. 1 MR. WAYNE GROSS: Yes. 2 MS. PICKARD: We don't want this 3 to be 611. 4 MS. LAMBERTON: Right, right. 5 MR. WAYNE GROSS: I'm sorry. 6 7 What --MS. LAMBERTON: We're trying to 8 get -- she -- yeah, we don't want a --9 MR. CARBONE: We don't want 10 11 another 611. MS. 
