2 MS. LAMBERTON: I would like to 1 call the board of supervisors regular business 2 meeting of April 23, 2019 to order. And we'll 3 begin with the pledge of allegiance, please. 4 (Pledge of allegiance was 5 6 recited.) Thank you. We MS. LAMBERTON: 7 have a couple of announcements. April 23, 2019, 8 which is today, we had executive from 5:30 p.m. to 9 6 p.m. to discuss building security. Next month 10 the board of supervisors' meetings are scheduled 11 for May 20th, at 8:30 a.m. and 9:30 a.m. 12 I will entertain a motion to 13 consider the minutes of the March 19, 2019 work 14 15 session. MR. CARROLL: So moved. 16 MS. PICKARD: Second. 17 Motion and MS. LAMBERTON: 18 19 second. All in favor? 20 MS. CANFIELD: I do have --21 MR. HOLAHAN: Aye. 2.2 MS. CANFIELD: I'm sorry. Ι 23 24 have suggested changes. MS. LAMBERTON: I apologize. 25 Go

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3 1 ahead. MR. CARBONE: I missed 2 3 something? MS. CANFIELD: So the 3/19/19 4 work session, Steven Michaels is spelled 5 M-i-c-h-a-e-l-s and it should be M-i-c-h-i-e-l-s. 6 There's also Pinecrest, it is two words and it 7 8 should be one word. MR. LAMBERTON: Second. All in favor? 18 19 BOARD MEMBERS: Aye. MS. LAMBERTON: Any opposed? 20 Seeing none. Motion carries. 21 I'll entertain a motion to 22 approve the March 25, 2019 work session. 23 24 MR. CARROLL: So moved. 25 MS. PICKARD: Second.

5 MS. LAMBERTON: All in favor? 1 2 BOARD MEMBERS: Aye. 3 MS. LAMBERTON: Any opposed? Seeing none. Motion carries. 4 5 I'll entertain a motion to approve the April 10, 2019, joint board of 6 supervisors and Pocono Township Commissioners 7 8 meeting. 9 MR. HOLAHAN: So moved. MR. CARROLL: Second. 10 MS. LAMBERTON: All in favor? 11 MR. CARROLL: Aye. 12 13 MR. CARBONE: Aye. MS. PICKARD: Aye. 14 15 MR. HOLAHAN: Aye. MS. LAMBERTON: And I'll abstain 16 17 I was not in attendance. 18 I will entertain a motion to 19 approve the treasurer's report for March 2019. 20 MS. PICKARD: So moved. 21 MR. CARBONE: Second. MS. LAMBERTON: Motion and 22 23 second. 24 Any questions or comments? 25 MS. PICKARD: I just had a

6 question I wanted to ask. Can we have the interest 1 rate on the reports for our bank account? 2 MS. CANFIELD: Yeah. 3 MS. LAMBERTON: Any other 4 questions or comments from the board? 5 Seeing none. All in favor? 6 7 BOARD MEMBERS: Aye. MS. LAMBERTON: Any opposed? 8 Seeing none. Motion carries. 9 T'll entertain a motion to 10 approve the bill pack in the amount of \$561,040.65. 11 MR. CARBONE: Make the motion. 12 MS. PICKARD: Second. 13 MS. LAMBERTON: Motion and 14 15 second. 16 Questions or comments from the 17 board? No? All in favor? 18 BOARD MEMBERS: Aye. 19 20 MS. LAMBERTON: Any opposed? 21 Seeing none. Motion carries. Moving on to the solicitor's 22 23 report. Public hearing for the proposed zoning ordinance, the MUTCD, M-U-T-C-H -- or C-D Zoning 24 25 District.

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7 This is an MR. REISS: Yes. 1 ordinance that has been advertised for a public 2 hearing tonight. It has also been sent to the 3 county and township planning commissions for review 4 and comment. It basically changes the name of the 5 Planned Retail Entertainment and Dining District to 6 the Mixed Use Town Center Development District. 7 And the only other thing it does, other than 8 9 changing the names is, it cleaned up a typographical error regarding parking aisle versus 10 11 parking angle. So with that, you may want to 12 open up the public hearing. 13 MS. LAMBERTON: I'll entertain a 14 motion to open the public hearing. 15 MR. CARROLL: So moved. 16 17 MS. LAMBERTON: Do I have a 18 second? MS. PICKARD: Second. 19 MS. LAMBERTON: All in favor? 20 21 BOARD MEMBERS: Aye. Is there any 22 MS. LAMBERTON: public comment for the hearing? 23 If you could just get up 24 Yes? and state your name for the record, please. 25

MR. RALPH GUNDRUM: Ralph 1 I'm in-house counsel for Kalahari 2 Gundrum. This zoning district surrounds the 3 Resorts. Kalahari Resort and there were a couple of things 4 that predated really these changes that -- and 5 concerns we had. We have discussed those with the 6 owner of this land. We're not suggesting any 7 changes here tonight, which I understand is 8 procedurally problematic, but I just wanted to --9 to talk a little bit about the changes that we 10 propose and the status of those with PMI. And 11 PMI's counsel's here and can talk about that too. 12 The first two concerns I'll sort 13 of lump together. One of the permitted uses is as 14 a hotel, that violates a non-compete. There is a 15 second use as well that is a truck and delivery 16 distribution terminal that could cause problems to 17 us because they're -- they tend to be loud, et 18 cetera. And I think a standalone commercial truck 19 term -- delivery terminal was never proposed 20 So my understanding is, at a later date 21 anyway. we're going to work with PMI to remove both of 22 those and they don't have any problems with that. 23 The third thing and we've got to 24 really get into this a little bit with PMI is, I 25

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understand the ordinance, the town's noise 1 ordinance doesn't apply at all to this -- this 2 property, obviously with close to a thousand hotel 3 rooms, that could be problematic for us, there's 4 some dispute. And so we need to actually look into 5 whether what I just said is true or not, I think 6 it's out under this ordinance. If I'm wrong not, 7 than that's not necessarily a problem, but we'll 8 work with PMI on that or Pocono Manor on that. And 9 we don't think at the end of the day, that will be 10 problematic, but it's something we're working on 11 12 with them. And I -- I just MS. LAMBERTON: 13 asked Jonathan and he said at this point we don't 14 know because of the exceptions of the --15 MR. REISS: I don't have the 16 17 zoning ordinance with me tonight. Yeah, I MR. RALPH GUNDRUM: 18 think -- I think the second one 155.11.Q is the --19 the noise ordinance. So I think it was pulled out 20 of applicability to this with nothing else put in. 21 And I don't know if the town's default noise 22 ordinance is overly burdensome to them, we're not 23 looking to be overly burdensome; but, you know, 24 we're also not looking for an all-night concert 25

10 venue that will be adjacent to, like I said, a 1 thousand families sleeping. 2 MS. LAMBERTON: And I don't 3 think that that was anyone's intention to have that 4 I -- I not in there applied to the property. 5 assumed and I -- I don't have the ordinance in 6 front of myself either, but I would assume that 7 this same ordinance that is put upon the entire 8 township should be utilized at least in the -- in 9 the district as well. That would be just my 10 11 opinion. 12 MR. RALPH GUNDRUM: Like I said, I don't know the details of the noise ordinance and 13 whether it makes sense to make some exceptions in 14 15 it or not. MS. LAMBERTON: Well, thank you 16 for bringing that to our attention because that is 17 something that I think we need to be aware of. 18 19 Does anyone else -- yes? 20 MR. RALPH MATERGIA: Good 21 evening. MS. LAMBERTON: Can you just 22 23 state your name for the record, please? MR. RALPH MATERGIA: Ralph 24 Materia, counsel for PMI, Pocono Manor Investors. 25

Essentially what Ralph, my other Ralph, stated is 1 accurate. As Jonathan knows, I worked on the 2 original draft. I actually drafted the original 3 draft to this ordinance and whether we -- if we 4 bring in some provisions on noise in the zoning 5 ordinance or you deal with it at the time of land 6 development, which is another way to handle it, 7 we'll give some greater detail to that as between 8 the two parties to see that we can maintain our 9 cooperation together and be good neighbors. We 10 understand there's a hotel of people sleeping next 11 door so we have to accommodate that to some degree. 12 I think we can work that out. 13 The hotel use is -- well, I'll 14 start with when I drafted this ordinance and you 15 accepted it, it was really to be very flexible, to 16 be as broad as we could to invite development on 17 this property. We worked so hard to get the 18 infrastructure to the site and so forth, so -- but 19 we do have existing land restriction, use 20 restrictions, that's between us and recorded 21

documents and we certainly live up to our contract obligations. We can't build a hotel on our property, that is subject to this restriction being a portion that is in this area -- or in this zone.

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12 So taking it out of the zoning ordinance at a later 1 date, just sort of belts and suspenders, I suppose, 2 3 we'd be willing to do that. Hope you pass this 4 thing tonight. 5 MR. CARROLL: Ralph, do mind if 6 I ask a question? MR. RALPH MATERGIA: 7 Go ahead. MR. CARROLL: My recollection is 8 faulty sometimes. I recall working with you on the 9 original draft ordinance for the PCRED and I think 10 you and I had the discussion no truck terminals, no 11 12 gas stations. 13 MR. RALPH MATERGIA: Right. 14 MR. CARROLL: And I couldn't put 15 my hand on that, but I see this come back up again and I also see some things with lighting and things 16 17 that I believe that were in our ordinance as 18 155.11.H that I believe was in our original one. 19 So I just -- if you can refresh my memory of that dialogue that we had. I think we got rid of some 20 21 of these things that are concerning --22 I think MR. RALPH MATERGIA: what was meant by the distribution was, that what 23 was thought about or envisioned at the time is that 24 25 there was gonna be a lot of retail aspects to this

development and getting -- and, as well as restaurants and getting product in and out of there would probably be buying into a centralized area and then distributed from there, rather than having delivery trucks at the front door of every -- you know, of every business because it's -- it's being proposed as a town center.

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8 So just like, for example, when you -- when you're on Main Street in Stroudsburg 9 10 and you have to slow and course around trucks are parked in the public right-of-way, which they're 11 allowed to do to make deliveries to the front door 12 of the locations that they are serving, we want to 13 avoid that. We want to get the distribution and 14 the centralized area and then take it from there to 15 16 the facilities.

MR. CARROLL: I think what we were saying is this was an entertainment family oriented entertainment experience --

20 MR. RALPH MATERGIA: Without a 21 doubt. 22 MR. CARROLL: -- and not another 23 Fed-Ex freight terminal 24 MR. RALPH MATERGIA: Right.

That was never the intention. We can certainly

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14 pull that out if we need to in a subsequent 1 2 amendment. MR. CARROLL: That was just my 3 recollection of the things that we looked through 4 when we were drafting this is, you know --5 MR. RALPH MATERGIA: So that you 6 understand, I'm not working directly on -- on the 7 development side with the tenants and so forth, so 8 -- but what I can tell you that at some point this 9 is getting attraction and it would be hoped at some 10 time, perhaps this year, we'll begin with initial 11 land use plans, which, of course, require a lot of 12 review. And once they have a better idea of what 13 they're gonna put and where they are going to put 14 it, that will start to develop itself and get the 15 planning documents that can be presented and get 16 17 your input. May I ask you a MR. REISS: 18 question? Well, either of you a question. Will 19 one of you let me know when you've worked out these 20 three issues? 21 I'll be the MR. RALPH MATERGIA: 22 first to call you. 23 MS. LAMBERTON: Well, good. 24 Nice to see that it's -- good. 25

MS. PICKARD: Yeah. I just 1 wanted to ask one question have all the items been 2 addressed from the county's review? 3 MR. REISS: The county's review 4 have the same comments that they had when they 5 6 reviewed the --The PCRED. MS. LAMBERTON: 7 MR. REISS: -- the Planned 8 Commercial Retail Entertainment Dining District. 9 None of the comments have changed. The basic 10 comments are that there aren't a lot of standards 11 in here by which you're gonna review the plans, 12 because you made it as flexible as possible. 13 14 MS. PICKARD: Okay. I think to review MR. CARROLL: 15 signage and lighting or something, right? 16 Well, you can --17 MR. REISS: there's a master signage plan that you'll review, 18 but you don't have a lot of standards even if 19 20 they're --MS. PICKARD: So we allow 21 22 (inaudible). MR. REISS: Yes. 23 MS. PICKARD: Well, on No. 8 is 24 says that there's a reference to the PCRED in our 25

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16 ordinance. 1 That was taken out. 2 MR. REISS: That was taken 3 MS. PICKARD: 4 out, okay. MS. LAMBERTON: Any other public 5 6 comment? Yes, sir. If you could just 7 state your name, this is a whole other --8 MR. LLOYD VOUGHT: Lloyd Vought. 9 I brought to the attention of this board, quite a 10 while ago before the plaza was put in, that I was 11 concerned about the noise level. It was suggested 12 that there should be something to dampen that 13 And I think I was told by several of you 14 noise. board members that -- that they were going to put 15 trees in, which I made reference to. 16 There seems to be more emphasis 17 on these two gentlemen's problems over there with 18 noise than there was in Camelot Forest and at that 19 time, you said it wouldn't be a problem. And I 20 invited some of the board members to come to my 21 house to listen to all that noise. 22 Now this board is very concerned 23 about these people, giving them a lot of time and 24 effort and yet, you weren't even concerned about 25

our neighborhood in Camelot Forest. That irritates 1 me and that was wrong, very wrong. And just 2 because this is a big company, your attention for 3 these people. And you didn't even care about the 4 citizens in this township that I live right over 5 6 here. Well, that's not MS. LAMBERTON: 7 I remember having this conversation -- if I 8 true. may, please -- and I recall stating the noise from 9 80 was probably more than the noise that you would 10 get from that Liberty Fuel and we did --11 Those trucks MR. LLOYD VOUGHT: 12 were in there 24 hours a day and that's not what 13 was said, ma'am, uh-uh. You said it wouldn't be a 14 problem, you couldn't even hardly hear it. 15 MS. LAMBERTON: Okay. Well --16 The attention MR. LLOYD VOUGHT: 17 this board has given these two guys for that big 18 company over there is a ludicrous, ludicrous. 19 MS. LAMBERTON: We give -- we 20 give the same attention to every project that comes 21 22 in. You did not MR. LLOYD VOUGHT: 23 to my wife and I, we were cut short. 24 MS. LAMBERTON: Well, I 25

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18 apologize that you feel that way, but that is not 1 2 MR. LLOYD VOUGHT: I don't feel 3 that way, I know that way. 4 MS. LAMBERTON: Okay. Okay. 5 MR. LLOYD VOUGHT: I have notes 6 7 on it. That -- that's MS. LAMBERTON: 8 9 MR. LLOYD VOUGHT: And my wife. 10 I understand MS. LAMBERTON: 11 what you're saying, but that is not how I view it. 12 I view that these folks bring a plan in and as long 13 as they meet our ordinance and what's required, we 14 are -- at that point, we need to approve it. So if 15 the Liberty Discount Fuel, which we're really not 16 discussing right now, this is an open hearing for a 17 zoning ordinance that is being proposed; but if 18 that -- if that is what the plan has been approved, 19 it meets the ordinance, sir, we have to approve it. 20 We were blown MR. LLOYD VOUGHT: 21 off by this board in a very quick manner. These 22 fellows back here, man, they're getting a lot of 23 24 attention. Why? MR. CARBONE: Well, I think 25

19 1 you're wrong. MS. LAMBERTON: Yeah. 2 MR. CARBONE: As I look at 3 everything face value. I wasn't around when you --4 so don't accuse --5 MR. LLOYD VOUGHT: I didn't 6 7 accuse you. MR. CARBONE: Right. You're 8 9 saying the board --MR. LLOYD VOUGHT: (Inaudible) 10 11 on the board. MR. CARBONE: You're saying the 12 board, that means all of us. 13 The MR. LLOYD VOUGHT: 14 responsible board at that time. 15 MR. CARBONE: Well, I think 16 everybody here that I've worked with since I've 17 been on the board takes the care of everybody that 18 comes forward. So I think you're wrong, but that's 19 20 just my opinion. MR. LLOYD VOUGHT: I think 21 22 you're wrong. MR. CARBONE: Well, that's fine. 23 MR. LLOYD VOUGHT: That's my 24 25 opinion.

20 All right. MS. LAMBERTON: 1 Let's get back to the hearing and then we'll take 2 public hearing and answer whatever we can from you, 3 if that is okay with you. Okay? We just need to 4 complete this. 5 I just feel MR. LLOYD VOUGHT: 6 that I was prejudiced in reference to my 7 8 neighborhood. I apologize that MS. LAMBERTON: 9 you feel that way, that has never been my 10 11 intention. MR. LLOYD VOUGHT: You don't owe 12 me an apology, I'm just giving my opinion. 13 That's okay. MS. LAMBERTON: 14 MR. HOLAHAN: It's noted. It's 15 16 noted, Mr. Vought. MS. LAMBERTON: Okay. So moving 17 back to the actual hearing that we have open at 18 this time, I think we need to --19 MS. PICKARD: Motion to close 20 21 the hearing. MS. LAMBERTON: Yeah, we'll 22 23 close --MR. REISS: Did you get all 24 public comment? 25

21 1 MS. LAMBERTON: Does anyone else 2 have any other comments or questions for the actual 3 hearing content? No? 4 MR. HOLAHAN: Motion to close 5 the hearing. 6 MS. PICKARD: Second. 7 MS. LAMBERTON: All in favor? 8 BOARD MEMBERS: Aye. 9 MS. LAMBERTON: So --10 MR. REISS: Now you have before 11 you proposed Ordinance No. 549. 12 MR. HOLAHAN: Make a motion that 13 we -- we can approve it at this meeting now? 14 MR. REISS: Yes. 15 MR. HOLAHAN: Okay. Make a 16 motion that we approve Ordinance --17 So give me the number again, 18 please. 19 MR. REISS: 549. 20 MR. HOLAHAN: -- 549 amending 21 the Zoning Ordinance of Tobyhanna Township, Monroe 22 County, PA to rename the Planned Commercial Retail 23 Entertainment Dining District as the Mixed Use Town 24 Center Development District, which is actually 25 easier to say. That's my motion.

22 MS. LAMBERTON: And are there 1 2 any conditions that have to be discussed? MR. CARROLL: Can we condition 3 4 upon the attorneys --5 MR. REISS: No, there's no 6 conditions for adopting this ordinance. Well, don't they 7 MR. CARROLL: 8 have to -- want to change if they disagree? MR. REISS: But you don't place 9 conditions on ordinances only on land developments 10 11 and subdivision. And we'll 12 MS. LAMBERTON: 13 address those concerns at that time? Correct, 14 MR. RALPH MATERGIA: 15 yes. 16 MR. HOLAHAN: If we get a 17 second, we can discuss this, right? MS. LAMBERTON: Yes, if we get a 18 19 second. 20 MR. CARBONE: Second. 21 MR. CARROLL: Oh, I'm sorry. 22 MS. LAMBERTON: Yes. MR. REISS: So there's -- this 23 is an ordinance, either you adopt it or you don't 24 25 adopt it; you don't place conditions or anything.

23 There's been discussion that the attorneys for the 1 two properties owners are going to talk about a 2 couple, maybe three issues and come back with a 3 proposal to amend your ordinance at a future date. 4 That's not what you're voting on tonight. 5 MR. HOLAHAN: Right. 6 Tonight you're just 7 MR. REISS: voting to either approve this ordinance or not 8 approve this ordinance. 9 I speak in favor MR. HOLAHAN: 10 of the motion the way it's been presented because 11 we will resolve these other items later amending 12 13 the ordinance. MR. CARROLL: I'm sorry. I'm 14 conf -- I would -- it would be my suggestion to 15 table it until we -- why -- why adopt an ordinance 16 and then change it again? 17 MR. REISS: Until this -- the 18 proposed developer would like this passed --19 adopted as soon as possible because it will help 20 with some legislation in Harrisburg. The new 21 2.2 change of the name is very important. MR. CARROLL: Yes -- okay. 23 I have a motion MS. LAMBERTON: 24 25 and a second.

24 Any questions or comments from 1 the board? 2 3 Call the vote. Brendon? MR. CARROLL: I vote in favor. 4 5 MS. LAMBERTON: Dave? MR. CARBONE: I vote in favor. 6 Heidi? 7 MS. LAMBERTON: MS PICKARD: I vote in favor. 8 John? 9 MS. LAMBERTON: MR. HOLAHAN: Yes. 10 MS. LAMBERTON: And I'll 11 12 abstain. Motion carried. Moving on to new business. 13 Consider adopting revised Resolution 2019-009 14 appointing Charles Schwab Bank to serve as 15 custodian for the Tobyhanna Township Nonuniformed 16 17 Employee Pension Plan. MS. PICKARD: Why was this 18 19 revised. It was revised 20 MS. CANFIELD: because the first one had incorrect names in the 21 wrong places, so this fixes that and puts everyone 22 23 in the correct positions. MS. PICKARD: I'll make a motion 24 that we approve Resolution 2019-009. 25

So with that being said, if you appoint 9 primary dispatch area to Mount Pocono Borough -- or 10 I'm sorry, Pocono Mountain Fire Company, Mount 11 Pocono Borough picks up their workman's comp. That 12 will increase their workman's comp payment. They 13 14 don't just do it by the little percentage of the area they cover, they do it by population. 15 Thev will end up paying -- Mount Pocono Borough will end 16 up paying workman's comp for another almost 9,000 17 people that are in Tobyhanna Township. 18 MS. I'm working on getting the 25 date, but I'll let you know with the chief of staff

and the governor Mike Brunelle, so we will be --1 one of the items we'll be talking about obviously, 2 is this project and its importance. 3 The build grants -- and I don't 4 know if you talked lately with Bryan McFarland from 5 Denali, but the build grants have opened back up. 6 My understanding is they were getting close to 7 hiring a federal firm to write and to advocate for 8 that, which it probably puts -- and we had done it 9 the last time because the timing, but I think that 10 we're very capable at state work and I think we're 11 capable of federal work, but, you know, it's 12 probably better for another firm to assist in that. 13 And so they would not be paid by 14 the taxpayers, they would be paid Denali 15 Development to pursue that funding. We would help 16 them since we submitted the last application on 17 behalf of the township. We would help, you know, 18 provide them with some information and obviously 19 the previous application. We 22 missed the DCNR round this year, that's in April 23 every year, pretty much, as long as the governor 24 continues to fund DCNR. 25
